AirPods Pro 2 as Hearing Aids?

Apple's AirPods Pro 2 have taken a surprising step into the world of hearing aids with the iOS 18 update. This change, authorized by the FDA, offers a potential solution for the 30 million Americans with hearing loss—especially those hesitant to try traditional hearing aids due to cost, fit, or stigma.

ow Well Do AirPods Pro 2 Work as Hearing Aids?

Audiologist Dr. Cliff Olson recently tested AirPods Pro 2's new hearing aid function. While they offer solid amplification for mild hearing loss, they don't quite match the performance of prescription hearing aids, particularly in clarity. Real ear measurement tests show that while they amplify sound, they lack the fine-tuned precision of professionally fitted devices.

Key Features & Limitations

To use AirPods as hearing aids, users need iOS 18.1 and must complete a hearing test on their phone.

"Our own internal study showed most patients couldn't do it or did it inaccuratley. The app does allow a user to upload a professional-completed Audiogram however."

The AirPods then adjust based on the results, but their battery life (3–4 hours) is a major limitation—compared to high-end hearing aids that last 16-24 hours per charge.

Customization settings include:

- Volume control
- Left/right balance adjustments
- Treble/bass enhancement
- Ambient noise reduction
- Conversation boost (prioritizes speech in front of the user)

While these adjustments help, they can't replace the expertise of a licensed audiologist who fine-tunes prescription hearing aids for individual needs.

Pros & Cons of AirPods as Hearing Aids Pros:

- Affordable (\$249) compared to prescription hearing aids, which can cost thousands
- Excellent sound quality & noise cancellation
- Great for occasional or situational use

Cons:

- Battery life is much shorter than dedicated hearing aids
- Visibility—AirPods are more noticeable than discreet hearing aids
- Lack of professional support compared to dedicated hearing aid providers



Are They Worth It?

AirPods Pro 2 work well as an introduction to hearing aids for those with mild to moderate hearing loss. Their affordability and accessibility make them an appealing option for people who aren't ready to commit to traditional hearing aids. However, they fall short in all-day usability, clarity, and battery life. As the case with most over-the-counter products

For those needing consistent hearing support, prescription hearing aids remain the better choice. But for occasional use—like meetings, conversations, or watching TV—AirPods Pro 2 offer a convenient, cost-effective alternative, for those with mild hearing loss
